Welbeing

Dosbarth 7 are having a wonderful week and really putting into practice perseverance and resilience.

In swimming they have been learning lifesaving skills, to see their confidence and ability grow has been amazing!

During rugby, with Mr Meyers, Dosbarth 7 have been taught tag rugby this week and are becoming more confident at tackling and running with the ball to get to the touch line.

The Action for Children Bounce Back lessons have been delivered for the 3rd week and the learners have been taught how to cope with emotions. They have learnt strategies such as 5,4,3,2,1 - 5 things you can see, 4 things you can hear, 3 things you can smell, 2 things you can touch and 1 thing you can taste.

We have been getting outside as much as possible and playing class games including a coronation treasure hunt.



Mobile Phones-important information

We recognise that mobile phones are part of everyday life for many children and that they can play an important role in helping pupils to feel safe and secure. However, we also recognise that they can prove a distraction in school and can provide a means of bullying or intimidating others.

It has therefore been agreed that:

- Pupils may be given permission to bring mobile phones into school if they are walking to or from school without parents (usually years 5/6 only).
- Parents must complete a Pupil Mobile Phone Form to request permission before their child brings a mobile phone to school.
- The phone must be handed in to the classteacher or school office on arrival at school and must be switched off
- The phone is left at the owner's own risk and school is not responsible for loss or damage
- Phones must not be taken on school trips/visits
- Children are not permitted to bring in any other communication devices, such as smart watches, that could be used to record sound or images, or send or receive messages.

Breaches of the above conditions could lead to the school confiscating the device and withdrawing permission for the child to bring their phone in to school. If a device is confiscated it will be held in the school office and will need to be collected by a parent/carer.
